## *The Friends and Residents of Mackinac Island,*



We hope you are enjoying a wonderful summer wherever you may be. Our 2010 Annual Report is gratefully presented to you who make it all possible. With the ever present concerns about the economy highlighted to us daily, your generosity in time, energy and financial support is a wonderful indication that you feel strongly about the purpose and mission of your Community Foundation.

Our endowments and donations grew at a great rate in 2010. Total donations/pledges received were \$333,445. Investment revenues were \$569,741 or roughly a 13% return for the year. We want to thank William Blair & Company for a great job in managing our assets.

Grants and Disbursements to area nonprofits, scholarships and emergency assistance totaled \$117,210 in 2010 up slightly from 2009.

2010 saw the implementation of several new programs and projects. The Foundation put out a survey to gather ideas and feedback. A committee began researching the need for and possibility of creating a Physical Therapy room at the Medical Center. We are working on creating a free Health Screening day for island residents and workers this fall. The interesting history of our island is another project that is beginning to gather speed through the Oral History Program. Stories will be gathered through interviews and put into a usable format for future use.

A Native American Museum to properly represent their role in the development of this area and display artifacts of their rich culture and heritage is being considered. Better access to quality home health care has been provided by improved communications with those that service our island in this regard.

Two of the biggest projects undertaken in 2010 and being implemented this year are:

The Bike Safety Program which held a helmet design contest in 2010 and has provided those helmets at cost to island residents, workers and visitors this summer. This year Nutcase In. helped us to manufacture our custom design, which MICF is selling at cost to promote helmet use. To date more than 200 helmets have been purchased. Lighthouse.net has given vouchers for all sixth grade and below students to receive free helmets. Many positive comments on the program have come our way. Future plans for the program include more bike safety activities for our residents, workers and visitors.

The Founders Scholarship Fund is our first multiple year award for island graduates. The fund will initially provide \$2,000 a year for up to four years. It was created with the help of 17 couples or individuals last July. The initial donations amounted to over \$180,000 with pledges for an additional \$200,000 over the next four years. The Scholarship Committee is working hard to raise the money to fully endow this fund for future generations.

As you can see 2010 was a very busy and productive year for your Community Foundation and set in place many projects for the future - a future we hope you will generously support with donations of your time, energy and finances in 2011 and beyond.

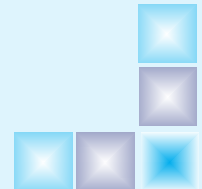

# Funds

*MICF's funds make grants to a variety of organizations in three broad areas of interest:*

## 1. Conservation and Preservation    2. Health and Wellness    3. Community Livability and Enrichment

### UNRESTRICTED FUNDS

#### **General Fund**

Gifts that are not designated to a specific interest or fund are placed in the general fund. This fund is used for grants for the good of Mackinac Island, its residents seasonal workers and visitors.

#### **Father Jim Williams Fund for Mackinac**

This fund was established by the Board of Trustees of the Mackinac Island Community Foundation in honor of Father Jim Williams in recognition of his efforts on behalf of the residents and visitors of Mackinac Island, on the thirtieth anniversary of his ordination and his receipt of the Foundation's first ever Outstanding Service Award.

#### **Joe B. Sullivan Memorial Fund**

The Joe B. Sullivan Fund meets ongoing or special needs on Mackinac Island. Grants from this unrestricted fund are varied and include support for programs in areas such as community enrichment, historic preservation, health and wellness and youth.

### CONSERVATION AND PRESERVATION

#### **Wilfred Puttkammer Mackinac Island Conservation Fund**

Established by Michael Straus in memory of his grandfather, this fund supports efforts to preserve the natural and historic resources, scenic vistas, and water and shoreline features of the island.

#### **Fund for the Preservation of Historic Documents and Photographs**

Started by the Maurer family in memory of Wesley Maurer, Sr., this fund was established to be used for the purchase of rare books for the Library, preserving historic photographs, maps or books or providing safe storage facilities for these items.

#### **The Pompa Fund for Preservation of Historic Structures**

Created by Mackinac Island summer residents Frank and Carole Pompa, this fund supports preservation of Mackinac Island structures and their historic architectural design.

#### **Preservation of Horse Tradition Fund**

This fund was established in 1998 by Mackinac Island Carriage Tours. It promotes the horse culture on the Island, through grants in support of such areas as riding scholarships and instructional clinics.

#### **Natural Resource Preservation Fund**

Kitty Hannabass established this fund in memory of her late husband, Hayden Hannabass. It helps to preserve and protect the natural beauty of the Island, including habitat, development and education.

#### **The Erin Lynne Shufelt Environmental Fund**

The Erin Lynne Shufelt Environmental Fund was established by the John Shufelt family in memory of their daughter, Erin, who loved Mackinac Island and its clean environment. Grants from this fund support environmental matters such as land use, clean water and air, waste disposal and preservation.

#### **Richard and Jane Manoogian Historical Preservation and Conservation of Open Spaces Fund**

This fund was created in 2003 by Richard and Jane Manoogian and is used to benefit the people of Mackinac Island through the preservation of open space.

#### **Barbara and Frank Lewand Fund**

This fund was created in 2002 by Kathy and Tom Lewand in memory of Tom's parents, to support conservation and preservation of Mackinac's unique nature and community.

#### **Mackinac College Legacy Fund**

Started in 2003, the Mackinac College Legacy Fund was started in tribute to the former college's motto, "To Live, To Learn, To Lead" and will address Mackinac Island issues concerning education and the environment.

#### **Mackinac Island Cemetery Preservation Fund**

Created by Clayton and Anna Timmons in 2004, this fund was created to support the works of the Mackinac Island Cemetery Board. Projects include repair and maintenance of the stone walls and the marking of unmarked graves in the cemeteries.

#### **Mackinac Conservancy Fund**

This fund was created in 2005 by member of the Mackinac Conservancy to further the work of this organization in educating landowners on Mackinac Island about conservation and preservation of their space.

#### **Eileen Erwin Croghan Fund**

This fund was created by Maeve and Nicki Croghan in memory of their mother in 2008. The fund will promote the preservation of open space on Mackinac Island and education about the unique natural beauty and character of the island.

#### **Bat Conservation and Education Fund**

Created in 2010, this fund promotes education about the importance bats play in our environment.

### HEALTH AND WELLNESS

#### **Ambulance Fund**

The Ambulance Fund was established in 2005 with funds raised

to purchase a new ambulance for the Island in 2005. This excess money has been endowed to assist in future expenses associated with Mackinac Island's ambulance needs.

### **The Beaumont Fund**

Established in the 1920's, the Beaumont Emergency Operating Fund provided necessary medical equipment to doctors on the Island. The fund still operates today, existing in the MICEF endowment to support the medical needs of Mackinac.

### **Medical and Health Care Fund**

This fund is used to meet the variety of health and medical needs in the Mackinac Island community.

### **Donald and Valeria Bortz Health and Medical Care Fund**

Donald and Valeria Bortz, frequent visitors to the Island, created this fund to promote emergency medical services for visitors and residents.

### **The Harry Myron Fund**

Created in memory of the late Harry Myron, a former trustee of Mackinac Island Community Foundation, this fund supports health and medical programs on the Island.

### **Healthy Youth and Seniors Funds**

Mackinac Island Community Foundation began this fund with a portion of the National Tobacco Settlement. The fund benefits youth and senior health programs.

### **Bob Gilmore Hospice Fund**

The Bob Gilmore Hospice Fund is the creation of Island resident and long time taxi driver Bob Gilmore. After being diagnosed with a terminal illness, Bob wanted to establish the fund as his legacy and his way of showing gratitude to his community. This fund supports hospice services on Mackinac Island.

### **Olivia Chambers Fund for Chronic Illness**

Started in 2008 by her family, the fund, named in memory of their daughter and sister, will assist victims of chronic illness.

## COMMUNITY LIVABILITY FUNDS

### **Marlee Brown Musser Community Arts Fund**

This fund was created by renowned Michigan artist and Mackinac Island resident Marlee Brown Musser. It supports all areas of the arts including visual, musical, and performing arts and primary importance is given to programs serving young people.

### **Dora DuPont Williams Fund for Music**

The Dora DuPont Williams Fund for Music was established by her daughter, Susan Lenfestey, as a tribute to her mother's love of music and Mackinac. Dora enjoyed spending much of her Island time working to create a music festival on Mackinac bringing in many groups, including the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. This fund is used to bring high quality live music to the Mackinac Island Public School and the Mackinac Island community.

### **Lorabeth M. Fitzgerald Fund for the Literary Arts**

Created by her family and friends to honor her love of poetry and the written word. This fund will provide for poetry readings and writing activities for seven years.

### **Music Fund**

The Mackinac Island Music Festival created this fund when the group disbanded in 1996. The Fund supports cultural activities and facilities on Mackinac Island.

### **Martin Petersen Fund for Historical Writing**

Established by Eugene and Marian Petersen in 1998 in memory of Dr. Petersen's grandfather, Martin Petersen, this fund celebrates the value of the history and archaeology of Mackinac Island and the Straits area. The purpose of this fund is to encourage historical writing with special emphasis on the Straits region.

### **Dr. Rex M. and Elizabeth C. Orr Fund for Animals**

Looking for a way to provide a lasting tribute to their father's life work, Debra and Sandra Orr created this fund. Established on the anniversary of their mother's birthday and in memory of their parents, this fund promotes and provides for preventative medical care for animals on Mackinac Island as well as educational programs that teach children how to care for their animals.

### **The Charlie Williams Fund**

From his post at Grand Hotel, Charlie Williams served the people of Mackinac Island for many years. He touched the lives of many with his special personality. Friends of Charlie Williams, along with the Mackinac Island Ladies Golf League, created this fund in his honor for recreational activities, especially golf, on the Island.

### **Bart Huthwaite Mackinac Island Boating Fund**

Woodbluff resident Bart Huthwaite began this fund in collaboration with the Mackinac Island Yacht Club. The fund promotes boating safety, sailing training and programs for scouts who come to the Island.

### **Joanne Zwolinski, Alice and Alan Sawyer Friends of Animals Fund**

Created in 2002, by Wayne Zwolinski in memory of his wife and her parents, this fund promotes the health and well being of Island animals and provides education on proper care and treatment of animals to Mackinac Island Public School children as well as the community at large.

## SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

### **Mark Gallagher Scholarship Fund**

This scholarship was established in memory of Mark Gallagher, a young Island resident who wished to serve his community as a police officer. The scholarship assists students pursuing careers in law enforcement, criminal justice or another type of service to Mackinac Island.

## Funds continued

### Founders Scholarship Fund

This is our first multiple year award program. Created in 2010 by island residents to further assist graduates of our school system in obtaining higher education.

### Frank Horn Scholarship Fund

This fund was established by friends of Frank Horn to honor his life. This fund will be used to assist island residents who want to further their education.

### Margaret W. and Wesley H. Maurer Scholarship Fund

As co-publishers of the Mackinac Island Town Crier, Margaret and Wesley Maurer valued education. The scholarship is awarded to Mackinac Island Public School graduates seeking higher education.

### Manoogian/Gallagher Scholarship Fund

Richard and Jane Manoogian created this fund to augment the Mark Gallagher Scholarship, this fund provides up to \$2,500 a year to island students to assist in their pursuit of higher education.

## DESIGNATED FUNDS

### Mackinac Island Medical Center Fund

Created to help provide a perpetual stream of revenue for medical care on Mackinac Island.

### Historic Trinity Episcopal Church Fund

The Historic Trinity Episcopal Church Fund was established to benefit the Trinity Episcopal Church. Income from this designated fund will return to the Church to provide an ongoing source of funding to protect and preserve this historic landmark institution.

### Mackinac State Historic Parks Fund

Mackinac State Historic Parks established this fund to provide perpetual support for the collecting, preservation, study and interpretation of the unique cultural and natural resources of the Straits of Mackinac region, through the activities of the Mackinac State Historic Parks.

### Mackinac Island Public Library, Sackfield Library and Library Special Projects Fund

These funds offer a permanent source of funding for the Mackinac Island Public Library.

### The Cornerstone Fund

Established in 1999 by the Sage Foundation, this fund supports the day-to-day operations and administration of the Mackinac Island Community Foundation.

### Mackinac Island Recreational Development Inc. (MIRD) Fund

The MIRD Fund was established to provide funding for MIRD's recreational activities on Mackinac Island. Grants from this fund support MIRD's operations and its programs including the Mackinac Island Ski Club and Great Turtle Park.

### Wawashkamo Preservation Fund

This fund is designated to support the efforts of the Wawashkamo Restoration and Preservation Fund to preserve the historic buildings of Wawashkamo golf course.

### Ste. Anne Catholic Church Fund

This fund was created in 2006 by the Parish to provide for perpetual care of the church and its programs for the community.

### MHA Community Stable Fund

Created in 2007 by the Mackinac Horsemen's Association to build a new community stable and promote all things horse.

### Lois Griffin Flower Basket Fund

Created by family and friends and will provide annual support for flower baskets on our streets.

## UN-ENDOWED FUNDS

### Rev. John M. and Florence L. Shufelt Rainy Day Fund

Created by a gift by Jeanie and John Shufelt in 1997, with an endowed version created in 2006, the Rainy Day Fund helps people of the Island face unexpected emergencies, natural disasters and se-

rious illness. Currently, the Medical Center, School, and three churches administer emergency assistance funds for short term needs on Mackinac Island. Rain Day Fund grants have supported these funds.

### Emergency Medical Fund

This fund was created in 2005 by an anonymous donor to help Island residents with unexpected costs associated with medical emergencies.

## DONOR ADVISED FUNDS

### William and Jean Allen Fund for Disaster Relief Near and Far

This fund was created by William and Jean Beardsley Allen in 2005 to assist with natural disasters and personal tragedies experienced both on Mackinac Island and abroad.

### Mackinac Fund

This fund was created in 2001 by an anonymous donor. Grants from this donor advised, un-endowed fund help the Island with special needs.

### Wendy L. Young Fund for Mackinac

This donor advised fund was created in 2004 by the Mike Young Family to assist with Mackinac's charitable needs.

### Henry C. and Audrienne Murray Family Fund

This donor advised fund was created by the Murray Family in 2004 to assist with Mackinac's charitable needs.
